Spring Cleaning! It's already June and if you haven't started, now is the time to get your propane installations maintained for the coming year.

Clean and Paint any propane tanks to provide a safe and long lasting professional looking installation. RMI can provide Sumter Coatings paint and tools. Gallons of enamels, primers, aluminum, mastics are available.



Decal your tanks and installations with the required labels and warnings. 4-in-1 placards, 1075, hazard class, propane and no smoking decals are available. Maintain compliance and legibility of your signage.

Test the cathodic protection on your underground tank accounts. We have half cells and testing kits and also anode bags if your tank's cathodic protection needs to be upgraded. If you need training on cathodic testing RMI's Technical Support Representatives can help.

After last winter get your tanks straight and level. RMI has Dandi-Blocks for both horizontal ASME tanks and vertical DOT or ASME cylinders and Fisk tank lifting jacks for leveling and supporting up to 1,000 gallon ASME tanks in hard to get to locations.

RMI CELEBRATES ITS 50TH ANNIVERSARY IN 2023!

In 1973 Mr. Ray Murray founded Ray Murray, Inc. and began distributing gas equipment including Sherwood regulators and valves, copper, brass, cylinders and other propane equipment products. The company started operations from Mr. Murray's home in Stockbridge, MA. As the business grew Mr. Murray was joined by his three sons Jim, Ray and John Murray.

The company expanded rapidly with the addition of new employees and new products. This growth required several moves and facility expansions, culminating in the construction of RMI's current headquarters in Lee, MA in 2001. Over time the business evolved from primarily propane and compressed gas equipment with the addition of hearth and outdoor living products.

Always forward looking, the Murray's formed a partnership with Mike Hopsicker to facilitate a planned transition of the company ownership. Prior to RMI, Mike was the CEO of Agway Energy Products, one of the largest marketers of propane, heating oil and HVAC services in the Northeast.

Mike joined the company in May 2005 as President, CEO and a minority partner gaining majority ownership in 2014 and 100% ownership of RMI in January 2021. Continuing the evolution of a family business, Mr. Hopsicker's son, Jeff Hopsicker, joined the RMI Board of Directors in 2019.

Blackmer Pioneering History

Before the turn of the 20th century, a rotary pump was generally understood to be a "gear pump," consisting primarily of two meshing gears which trapped liquid between the gear teeth and the pump housing creating small sealing cavities that transported fluid as it rotated, forcing the liquid out the other side.

In 1899 R. M. Blackmer invented a pump design that was an important departure from the old gear principle. In contrast to the flow rate from a aear pump that drops steadily as the gear teeth wear away, the loss from a vane-type pump is practically negligible. As the vanes wear away at the tips, they simply move further out of the rotor slots to self-adjust and maintain the original rate.

The original Blackmer pump has fathered a family of hundreds of different pump models including sliding vane, centrifugal and regenerative turbine technology.

WHAT'S WRONG WITH **THIS PICTURE?**

This propane regulator installation requires additional investigation for safety and code concerns.

1. The regulator vent is undersized and look where it terminates.

- Per NFPA# 58 2020 edition, 6.10.1.7 (2) states that the vent line must be at least the same size as the regulator vent connection pipe size. The vent size of this regulator is 3/4"NPT and the vent line appears to be 3/8" OD copper.
- o 6.10.1.7 (1) states that the discharge shall be directly vented to the outside air.

2. The iron pipe is corroded and penetrates the building below grade.

- Per NFPA#54 2021 edition, 7.2.2 states that if the piping is in contact with an atmosphere corrosive to the piping system, it shall be coated with a corrosion-resistant material.
- 7.1.5 provides information about piping through a foundation wall and what is required.
- IFGC 2021 edition, 404.6 prohibits the installation of gas piping that would penetrate a foundation wall.

3. Is this regulator still within the manufacturers recommended service life?

 Most manufacturers provide a recommended service life of their regulators and should be replaced when they reach this date.
Typically 20 to 25 years.
